Teacher & Parent Primer for Entering Projects On-Line

You have spent months guiding and encouraging your student(s) to produce a quality project to enter in the Mastodon Fair. Congratulations! The opportunity to compete for awards and scholarships has arrived! But don't stop there! Make sure your student(s), your school, and your district get credit for all the hard work by registering the entries on-line. It's easy and it's free. Here is what you need to know:

Free, On-Line Registration opens Jan. 2 and closes Wed., Feb. 11 @ 11:59 pm. Registration by mail costs \$5 and it must be received by Feb. 2

All projects must be registered by Wed., Feb. 11 to be eligible to compete in the 2009 Fair.

- Public, private and home schooled children are welcome
- All Jefferson County K-12 students are welcome,
- Students in 9-12 in Washington, Crawford and Franklin Counties may enter Art and Science projects.

Suggestion: Organize the registration information for each student prior to doing the registration. This includes: the correct spelling of each student's name, the student's gender, the student's correct address, phone number, email address and the student's parent's name, address, phone number and email address.

Remember – however the text is typed is how it will be published in the award listings. Please give correct and accurate information. It is used to contact students and parents on Saturday to inform them of special awards and to invite them to the Mastodon Award Ceremony on Sunday. Also, it is used to contact the parents if any problems

arise or if any additional, special opportunities become available for the students such as media interviews and additional art shows.

Five Steps to enter your Project On-Line

1. Go to www.MastodonFair.org. Look in the top left column. For Art entries click on ART, for Science entries click on SCIENCE.
2. The person (teacher or parent) who is responsible for registering the students must register themselves first. A valid e-mail is required as your password is sent via e-mail. Collect the password from the sent e-mail. (Tip - remember to look in the bulk mail or spam folder if it doesn't come back immediately in your regular e-mail.)
3. Enter your student(s).
4. Print out the finished entry form and bar code labels after each student or wait to the end and print them all at the same time. (Tip – print the labels on adhesive label sheets.) Changes may be made until registration closes on Wed., Feb. 11. Print out the revised registration form.
5. Obtain student and parent signatures and bring a copy of the signed forms to the fair.

How to Prepare Your Art Project for Display

All two dimensional art projects should be prepared for hanging.

1. Mount the art work on foam board, poster board, or matting. Secure a wire across the back of the project. Something as simple as paper clips, wire, and hot glue will do the trick!
2. All art entries must include an artist's statement. The statement should be written on a 3x5 index card. The information may include but is not limited to: media used, thoughts about the project, the motivation for the project, message of the art, and/or any technical information. Here is an example from the Missouri Conservationist, Volume 69, Issue 9, September 2008, used with permission from the editor.

About the photo entitled Pickle Springs Pines, Artist Davie Stonner wrote:

I arrived at Pickle Springs before sunrise one chilly morning last October, and I headed out on the 2-mile trail to see what the fall morning held in store. The sandstone arches, rugged boulders and rock fall along the path were interesting, but I decided to press on to the top of the bluff. Emerging from the woods onto the edge of the breathtaking precipice, the first rays of sunshine slipped over the tops of the pines, and the forest began to glow. I used a 24-70mm f/2.8 zoom lens on a tripod for this photo.

Oops! A Few Common Science Project Mistakes

Now that the project is done, and the registration process is complete, it's time to sit back and wait to win one of the special scholarships, awards and/or recognitions! Right? Wrong!

A final check should be done before turning in your project. Quite often simple mistakes can disqualify a project or significantly reduce the score. For a complete list of rules for both Art and Science entries, check out the Mastodon web site: www.MastodonFair.org. A complete list of scholarships, awards and special recognitions may also be found. A lot of work has gone into each exhibit; make sure you have followed all the entry rules! Here is a list of some of the most common mistakes on the Science projects and some of the simplest ones to correct.

ATTENTION TEACHERS **WIN \$100 FOR YOUR CLASSROOM** ***HERES HOW:***

1. Design a unique tree/bush to be used in the Dinosaur Egg Hunt Jungle using the following criteria:

- Max height: 8 feet Min. height: 4 feet
- Max width: 4 feet Min. width: 2 feet
- Must be weather proof, and must be freestanding.
- Trees/bushes may be constructed from saplings or old Christmas trees.*

**If constructing from saplings, cross 2 boards to form an X and attach to the bottom of tree to form stand. It is best to use screws to attach wood to bottom of trees. Christmas tree versions must have legs or stand.*

The Mastodon Fair helps students excel, from the inside out. The following is a true story on how the Mastodon Fair impacted Chris' life.

Chris was a Junior when he first entered the Science Fair. He was stunned when he was called in for the finalist interviews and, when told he should dress in good clothes, said his best was clean blue jeans. He didn't own any dress clothes. Chris won and willingly accepted coaching to help prep him for the International Science and Engineering Fair competition. When he arrived for coaching, his family of five, one grandparent and one uncle all arrived too...and asked if they could just sit quietly and watch the coaching. I was surprised to see the immense pride in their faces. For two hours, Mom, Dad and the entourage watched and listened. After talking with the family, they all took the hour drive up together because it was the first time anyone in their family had won such an award. His parents said they would figure out a way to get new charts done, get Chris some dress clothes and would help him practice his speech.

At the next meeting, every change was done, his speech was rehearsed and his little sister proclaimed she listened the "mostest times" of anyone. His grandfather bought him his first suit and dress pants to go with his first plane trip. Chris announced he was going to attend Jefferson College. His parents beamed...he would be the first family member to ever go to college. I asked Chris if he wasn't already planning to go to college and he responded, "No, I never thought I was smart enough. When I won the top award at the Mastodon Fair, I thought that I must be...so, why not try."

I ran into Chris as a Jefferson College student, and he told me of his dream to become a business manager and get his bachelor's degree. He was working his way up the ladder at retail locations and "would someday own his own business". I asked him if, two years ago he thought he would be in college, on his way to making his dream happen. His answer is the reason I love working for the Fair...Chris said, "Deep down I knew I could, but winning the Fair made me believe in myself enough to try." Today Chris is a Jefferson College Business student and is a manager of a restaurant. He said that every day he still draws upon the public speaking skills he learned, the experience of dealing with different cultures, and the research skills that he learned during his years of participation.

The Mastodon Fair helped Chris excel, from the inside out! Will you help us again so we can continue to provide other opportunities for kids to excel? We are expecting 3,000 students in our 30th year so we have a dramatic increase in the awards costs. ASK Room Chairperson

- Dates: Wed – Sat. March 18-21 during the day.
- Duties: Have packet for each vendor with the following: Map showing their room, info about hospitality available, their schedule, a certificate of participation and a thank you note.
- Greet ASK Room vendors each morning.
- Help Vendors get situated.
- Check to see if they need a drink or food during the day (10 AM Wed – Fri and 10 and 2 on Sat.)
- Write a thank-you note afterward.

Award Ceremony Chairperson

- Saturday, March 21, Set up for the Awards ceremony (Direct chair placement for Jeffco staff to set up on Friday, make sure microphones, screen and LCD projector are working and at the field house)
- Manage volunteer who makes the power point of all advertisers to make sure it is done and ready for showingand accurate!
- Work with volunteer Coordinator to get people to help organize students/teachers for walk in ceremony.
- Rehearse with Boy Scout troop for flag ceremony.
- Work with Desoto Jr. Singers for 10 minute pre-ceremony entertainment.
- Make sure booth backdrop is set up and work with the “Vanna White” volunteer to make sure signs are in the correct order.
- Make sure enough seats are reserved for students in center bleachers.
- Make sure signage is available for handicapped seating and overflow seating.
- Have VIP seating for board members, donors and dignitaries.
- Work with volunteers to check in presentation award winners.
- Figure out how to have students line up, process in and be seated in 3 minutes.

Field Trip Chairperson

- Be present during all the field trips days Wed – Fri 8:30 am – 2 pm.
- Greet all busses and groups
 - Present busses with written instructions for parking and pickup.
 - Get on the bus and instruct the students as to the process for the day’s events.
 - Create packets for teachers.
 - Document who came, when and how long they stayed.
 - Be cheery and an excellent representative/voice for the Fair.

Quartermaster

- Work with a group of volunteers to haul over all supplies for the Fair.
- Oversee all setup and tear down procedures.
- Be available periodically throughout the Fair to repair broken things.
- Oversee all packing of the storage units to ensure items will be in excellent shape for next year and are stored in the proper places.

Signage Chairperson

- In charge of all signage placement, movement and storage of signs.
- Work with three signage makers to have appropriate signs made before the Fair.
- Be at the Fair or have a trusted volunteer who has explicit instructions of how/where/when signage needs to be changed.
- Invent new signage that would help inform visitors of events/ locations/ directions/ etc.
