The Mastodon Art/Science Regional Fair is a 501(c)3 Non-Profit organization that is a separate entity from the Mastodon Historic Site. The Fair grew from and still has a strong relationship with the Mastodon Park and treasures the word "Mastodon" in its name.

Over 300 volunteers are required to operate the fair held at the Jefferson College Field House.

The Fair Does not receive government funding and must raise 100% of the operational costs each year. An endowment fund has been established to provide long-term stability and scholarships for the Fair.

The goal is \$2.5 Million by 2011.
